John Chrysostom, Archbishop of Constantinople

John Chrysostom died on Sept. 14, 407, in exile in Armenia. He was elected Patriarch of Constantinople in 397 where he served zealously for six years, sending missionaries to the pagan Celts and Scythians, purging the church of simony, writing a liturgy, and interpreting the Scriptures in many Bible commentaries that survive to this day. He was unjustly exiled twice for denouncing the cupidity of Empress Eudoxia. His last words were, "Glory to God for everything".

Advent Begins this week

Advent is the 40-day period before Christmas which is devoted to preparation for the coming of the Messiah. It begins on Nov. 15th and extends until Dec. 25th. It is a period of fasting, prayer, Scripture reading, church attendance and participation in the sacraments to enable us to capture the full meaning of Christ's coming.

To help Orthodox families observe Advent at home we recommend the book "How about Advent; An Advent Calendar for the Orthodox Christian Family." This book uses daily Scripture readings, family-centered activities such as making and using an eight candle Advent wreath, and familiar church hymns to involve the entire family in the Advent experience.

The Advent or Christmas fast, became the symbol of the prayers and fasts of the Old Testament patriarchs and prophets, who looked forward to the coming of the Messiah with great longing. During Advent the Church remembers many of the Old Testament Saints: Obadiah on Nov. 19th, Nahum on Dec. 01st, Habakkuk on Dec 2nd, Zephaniah on Dec 3rd, Haggai on Dec 16th, Daniel on Dec 17th, and the two last Sundays of December are dedicated to the Old Testament forefathers and Fathers.
